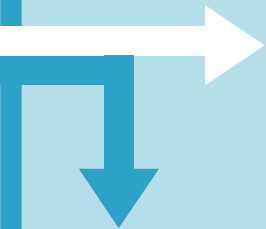

MSWE FAQ: What is Municipal Solid Waste (MSW)?

Municipal Solid Waste, also known as MSW, is any household or domestic waste comprised of everyday items such as product packaging, furniture, paper, clothing, bottles, yard waste, food scraps, newspapers, appliances and other organic and non-organic material. Although much of the MSW in the U.S. and around the world is transported to and buried in landfills, it can be used as a renewable fuel source for electric power generation.

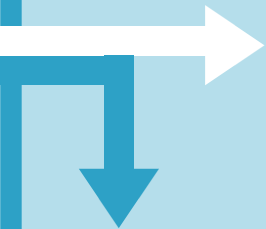
